

## Sustainability Study Report & Recommendation Policy 409 Tide Head School

## Sustainability Study Final Report and Recommendation Tide Head School

This sustainability study, conducted by the District Education Council (D.E.C.), was triggered by a significant reduction in student enrolment at Tide Head School at the onset of the 2018-2019 school year.

September 30, 2018 enrolment figures indicated that nine students were attending Tide Head School. By October 2018 this number had declined to eight students.

The sustainability study considered two options:

• Closing the school in June 2019, one year earlier than previously scheduled.

or

• Status quo; keeping the school open until June 2020.

## 3. Education Programs

A number of students currently attend Lord Beaverbrook School in the French Immersion Program.

Provincial funding provides one full-time teacher for every 21 students. Given the total number of students, from the Tide Head area, who could potentially register for the Gr. 1 French Immersion entry point (five students), this would not be a viable option.

In keeping with Policy 309, student enrolment in the local catchment area does not support the implementation of an early French Immersion program.

With a teaching complement of 1.5 full-time equivalents, providing services for special needs/gifted students is a major challenge. Staffing limits prevent the ability to provide specialized teachers at the school, i.e. Education Support teachers, Music teachers, etc.

The current student/teacher ratio at Tide Head School is not equitable when compared to other elementary schools in the district. Currently, Tide Head School has a ratio of 6.0 students/teacher. This compares to 11.1 students/teacher at Lord Beaverbrook School (L.B.S.) and 14.7 students/teacher at Rexton Elementary.

Patch work on the roof of Tide Head School was required this past summer as a temporary measure, and there are indications that the roof will need major repairs.

Four of the eight students are currently provided bussing. The other four students live outside the

catchment area and hence, do not qualify for

bussing services.

6. Operation Costs For the 2018-2019 school year, the cost per

student at T.H.S. is \$33,238.66. This has increased

by 300% in the past four years.

At Terry Fox Elementary School, the cost/student

is \$9,335.77. The provincial average for cost/

student is approximately \$10,000.00.

7. Impact on the Community There is minimal use by the community of Tide

Head School. The district rents space from St.

Andrew's United Church, which is attached to the

school.

8. *Impact on Other Schools* The eight students from Tide Head School can be

accommodated at Lord Beaverbrook School and

Campbellton Middle School.

9. Opportunities A move to L.B.S. would facilitate increased

learning opportunities for both staff and students.

Students would benefit from specialized

instruction in the areas of guidance, resource,

physical education and music.

Students would benefit from increased

socialization with peers.

Therefore, the Anglophone North District Education Council will recommend to Hon. Dominic Cardy, Minister of Education and Early Childhood Development, that Tide Head School be closed in June 2019 and that all students at Tide Head School be reassigned.
